Glossary Appendix A3

Add the following words with meanings.

Handling (as in “handling a firearm”) The act of manipulating, holding or gripping a firearm while the trigger is functionally accessible.

Draw .The point that the firearm is removed or disengaged from the holster so as to allow access to any portion of the interior of the trigger guard.

Dropped Gun (during the Course of Fire) ---- A condition in which a competitor loses

control of their handgun. Loss of control does not require the handgun to land on the ground or other range surface or prop. It occurs anytime the handgun is no longer in control of either hand, even if it is trapped against part of the body or caught in mid-air.
